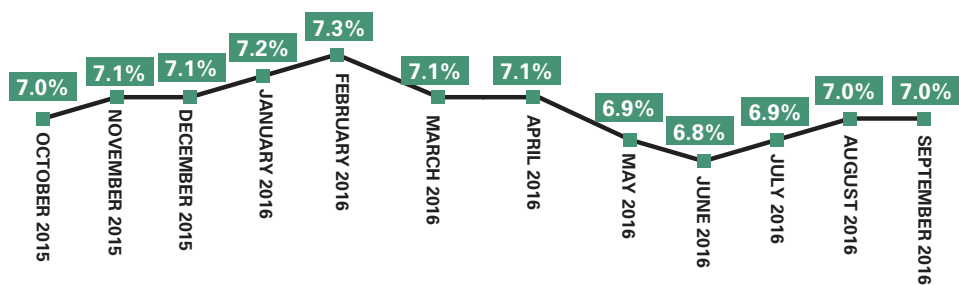

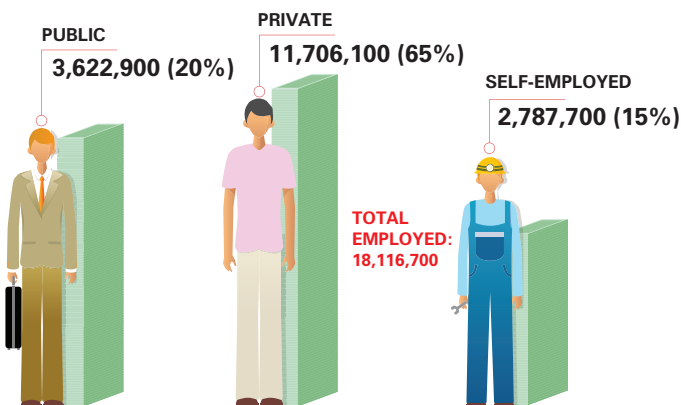

CANADA'S UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OVER THE LAST YEAR



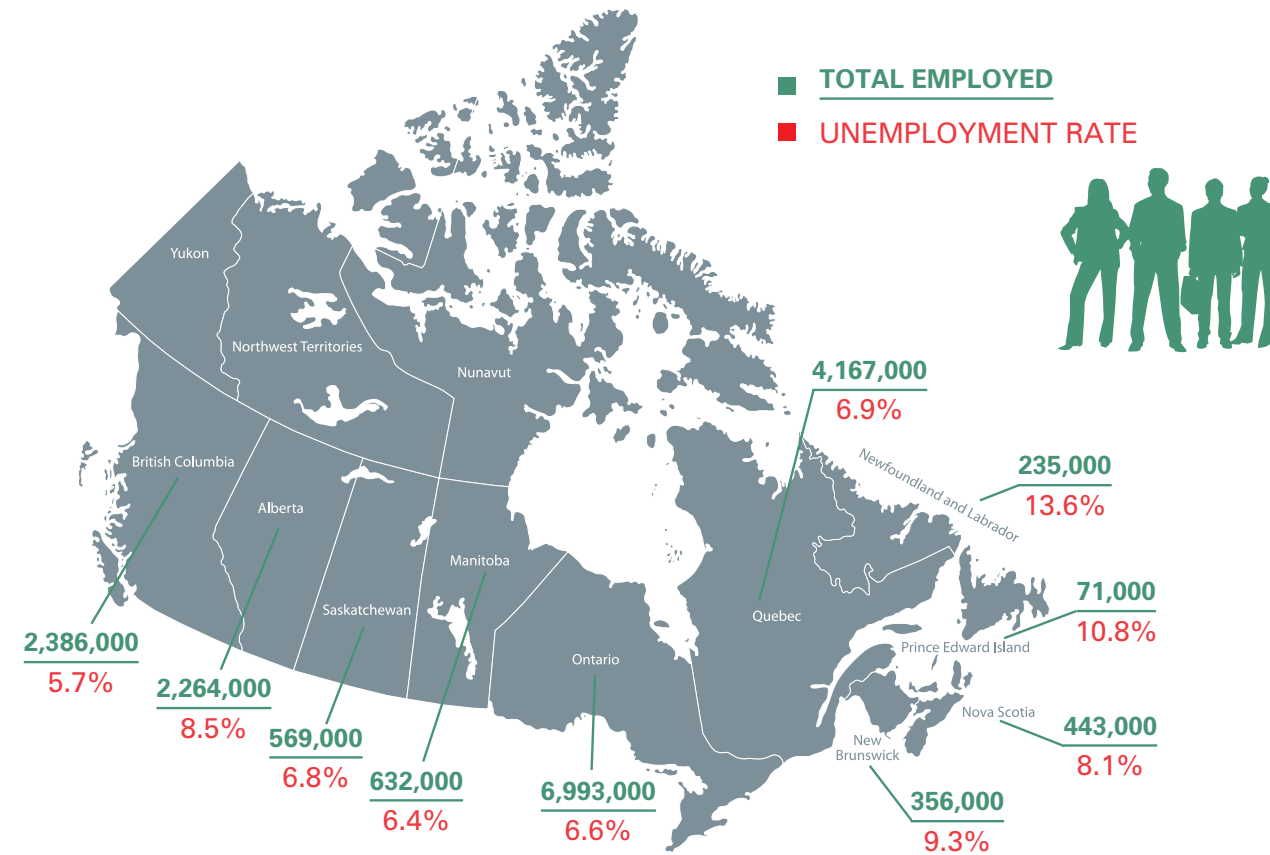
EMPLOYMENT PER SECTOR IN SEPTEMBER 2016

FAST FACTS

- Employment rose by 139,000 (+0.8%) over the past 12 months with most of the gains in part-time work.
- In September 2016, there were more employed people aged 55 and older.
- More people worked in public administration, educational services, and transportation and warehousing in September 2016. At the same time, employment declined in health care and social assistance.
- Self-employment increased in September, while there was little change in the number of private and public sector employees.
