Canada had 205,730 census farms in 2011, down 10.3% (or 23,643 farms) from the previous census.

Between 2006 and 2011, the average size of Canadian farms increased 6.9% from 728 acres to 778 acres. There were 293,925 farm operators reported in the 2011 Census of Agriculture, down 10.1% from 2006.

As the 5th largest agricultural exporter on the planet, Canada plays an important part in feeding the world. The sector contributed over \$100 billion annually to the country's GDP. Canada produces almost 80 percent of the world's maple syrup (12.2 million gallons in 2016, up from 7.8 million in 2012!) and is the world's largest exporter of flaxseed, canola, pulses and durum wheat.
